## Nab 'Dope Peddler Who Fled Hospital

INDIANAPOLIS (INS)—A dope peddler suspect, who fled from a Veterans' Administration hospital while awaiting trial on two federal narcotic charges, is back in custody today.

Albert Clyde Buggs, 34, a 90-pound tubercular who has declared he will "never live to stand trial" has been placed in an isolation ward at General Hospital.

Buggs was picked up by police Tuesday, who with federal officials, have been looking for the frail defendant since he fled the hospital on July 6.

Buggs faces two federal charges of unlawful sale of heroin. He has been described as the "second largest" supplier of heroin in Indianapolis.
